FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF ACADEMIC COOPERATION IN MANAGEMENT EDUCATION

The general objective of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to stimulate and facilitate the development of collaborative and mutually beneficial programs which serve to enhance the intellectual life and cultural development of both the institutes and to contribute towards increased mutual cooperation.

Thus both the institutes have agreed that in support of their mutual interests in the field of education and research:

1. The two Educational Institutions will:

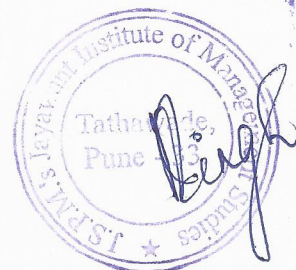
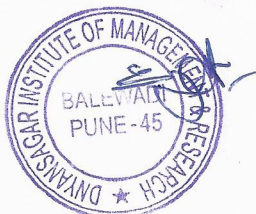
a) Cooperate in the exchange of information relating to their activities in teaching and research in fields of mutual interests. The two Institutes shall also be promoting and reinforcing cooperation, mutual exchange of Information and technological know- how, joint collaborative work in R&D projects, curriculum development, internships and placements, infrastructure development, improvement of research and academic programs and also exchange of experts and researchers.

b) Promote appropriate joint research projects and joint courses of study, with more focus on various funded projects by various Industries on National as well as International Level

c) Conduct short courses, as mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of such activities

d) Conduct cultural programs as, mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of such activities

e) Conduct study tours, as may be mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of such activities



2. Facilitate the exchange of students for various academic activities, short term courses and other cultural and extra-curricular activities as per the extant rules and regulations of both the institutes.

3. The aim of the Memorandum of Understanding shall be to achieve a broad balance in the respective contributions and benefits of the collaboration, and this shall be subject to periodic review by both Institutes.

4. Any other point which is not covered under this MoU but may be mutually beneficial for both the institutes.

This agreement will take effect from the date of its signing and shall be valid for a period of 7 years from that date unless sooner terminated, revoked OF modified by mutual written agreement between the two Institutes, and may be extended by mutual written agreement. Either party may terminate the Agreement at any time during this term by the provision of three months written notice to the other party.

The parties hereby agree to establish mutual collaboration on above areas.

Due to use of Plaster of Paris and some non-degradable elements, environment is getting effected. The most serious impact of the Shri Ganesh festival on the natural environment is, that the immersion Plaster of Paris getting into rivers and the water bodies. The toxic waste kills plant and animal life in the water. After the submerging of Ganesh idols, non-degradable substances of idols are appearing at the shore of lakes and sea. To minimize the impact on environment, we wanted to promote Eco-friendly Shri Ganesh celebration campaign.

Our Institute along with Dnyansagar Institute of Management and Research (DIMR) decided to educate those people who come for Ganesh Immersion on river. In all 24 students and 1 faculty member from our Institute and 6 students from DIMR, went to nearby Pavana River Ghat where Water Tanks were already placed by the Government Officials. 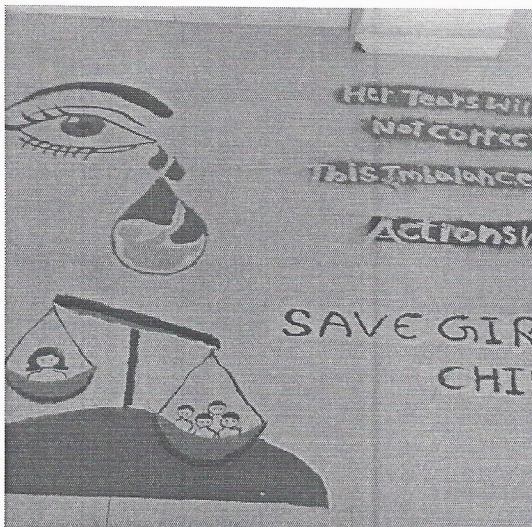
The Event was based on Socio-cultural themes like

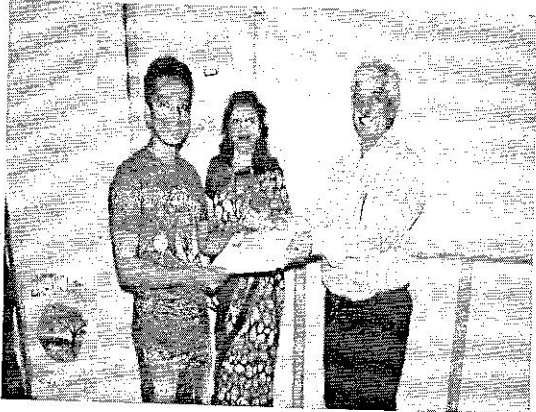

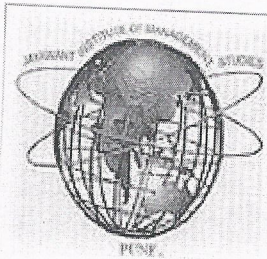

Later it was followed with small games like tug of war, antakshari and mimicry amongst the kids and the volunteers. There was also a motivational story telling session for the children.


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Later the volunteers thanked the care taker of the orphanage.


